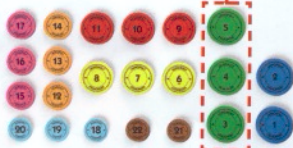

SET IT UP

- 1 Put the 22 coloured location stamps onto the matching colour bands on the gameboard.



- 2 Leave the 20 grey First Class stamps in the Banker's tray.



- 3 Shuffle the Chance cards and put them face down on the gameboard here. This is the draw deck.

- 4 Shuffle the Here & Now cards.

Deal two to each player, **face down**. Look at them now but keep them secret. You can use them at any time during the game.

Put the remainder of the deck face down on the gameboard here. This is the draw deck.



- 5** Choose a player to be Banker. The Banker is in charge of auctions, First Class stamps and the Bank's money.

Give each player:

2x 

4x 

5x 

(Total = ₹1500)

Put the remainder of the money in the Banker's tray.

- 6** Each player, take a passport and put it on a passport space on the gameboard.



- 7** Choose your token and put it on GO.

Put the dice by the gameboard.

- 8** The youngest player goes first. Play continues to the left.

PLAY!

How to win

- Travel around the gameboard visiting the world's most exciting places.
- Pay for the stamps of the places you land on and put them in your passport.
- Charge other players visitor fees to stop at places you have stamps for.
- The first player to fill their passport wins!



How to play

- 1 **Roll both dice** and move your token clockwise around the board that number of spaces. Every time you land on or pass **GO**, collect \$200.



Rolled the sneaky swapper?

- **Then do a sneaky swap!** Switch your last passport stamp with any other player's and don't move this turn.
- **Or move as normal** the number of spaces shown on the other die.

Note: The swap icon counts as 1 when rolling the dice for Chance card actions.

- 2 **Where did you land?**

See THE BOARD SPACES section on the next page for details.

- 3 **Rolled a double?** Move, then roll and move again.

Watch out! If you roll three doubles in a row, go directly to Jail.

- 4 **That's it!** Your turn is over. The player to your left goes next.

Start playing! Look up the board spaces as you land on them.

THE BOARD SPACES

Unowned locations (with stamp)

When no one owns the location, either buy it or auction it.

- **Want to buy it?** Pay the price shown on the red ticket and put the stamp into your passport.

Note: Place stamps in the left-hand column first. There is more on filling your passport on page 8 of this guide.

- **Don't want to buy it?** The Banker must auction it. Bidding starts at ₺20. Any player can bid. If no one wants it, that's fine. Leave the stamp where it is.



Owned locations (no stamp)

- You must pay the owner the visitor fee shown on the white ticket.
- If you own it, do nothing.

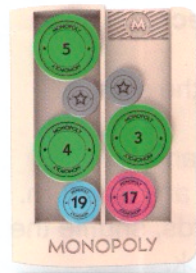
Watch out! The owner must ask for the fee before the next player rolls the dice; you snooze, you lose!



Out of money? See page 8 for details.



Colour set = double visitor fee & bonus passport stamp!



- 1 Take a **FREE First Class stamp** and add it to your passport if you get all the location stamps from a colour set.
- 2 The visitor fee owed is **double** on each location if you own the colour set. The stamps do not need to be next to each other in your passport.

THE BOARD SPACES continued



GO

Every time you land on or pass the GO space, collect $\$200$.



First Class

You must buy or auction a First Class stamp.

- To buy it, pay $\$100$ and put the stamp in your passport.
- If you don't want to buy it, the Banker must auction it. Bids start at $\$20$. Any player can bid. If no one wants it, that's fine. Leave the stamp where it is.
- If there are no stamps left, do nothing.



Airports

You can either take a flight or do nothing.

- To take a flight, pay $\$100$ to the Bank and move your token to any location or First Class space on the board. If you pass GO, do not collect $\$200$.



Here & Now

- Take the top Here & Now card and see what it says. **Keep it secret.**
- You can use Here & Now cards at any time.
- Don't forget to roll and move if you play a Here & Now card at the start of your turn.
- Don't forget the Here & Now cards you got at the start of the game!
- There is no limit to the number of Here & Now cards played on any one turn.
- Place used cards face up in a discard pile. If you run out of cards, shuffle the discard pile and place them face down to form a new draw deck.



Chance

Take the top Chance card and do what it says. Return used cards to the bottom of the deck.



Free Parking

Do nothing, just take a load off.



Just Visiting / In Jail

If you land here on your roll, do nothing. Pop your token on the Just Visiting section.



Go To Jail

Go directly to Jail. Do not pass GO. Do not collect $\$200$. That is the end of your turn!

Note: You cannot collect any visitor fees or bid in auctions while you're In Jail.

So, how do you get out of Jail? You have three options:

- 1 **Pay $\$100$** at the start of your next turn, then roll and move as normal.
- 2 **Use a Get Out of Jail Free card** at the start of your next turn, then roll and move as normal. Return the card to the bottom of the appropriate deck.
- 3 **Roll a double** at the start of your next turn. If you do, you're free! Use the roll to move. You can use up to three turns to try for a double. If you don't throw a double by your third turn in Jail, pay $\$100$ and use your last roll to move.

WIN!



WINNER!

The first player to fill their passport so the last stamp breaks the line at the top of the right-hand column wins!

Note: You cannot physically check stamp sizes to see which one will let you win!

EXTRA INFORMATION

How to place stamps in your passport



- Start in the left-hand column. Put the first stamp at the bottom. Any subsequent stamps must be pushed down to the lowest point.



- If you can't fit a stamp into the left side, place it at the bottom of the right-hand column. Your passport is now more than half full!

Run out of money?



- If you owe the Bank, return your last stamp to the board. Keep any cash you have.
- If you owe another player, give them your last stamp. Keep any cash you have.
- If you have no money and no stamps, do nothing; you've got it bad enough!

YOUR TOP PLACES IN THE WORLD



1. Lima

Adopted by Pizarro and the *conquistadores*, Peru's capital dates back to the days when the Nazca, Moche and Inca ruled the roost.



2. Hong Kong

As the Star Ferry plies its trade across the harbour, city streets hum with market traders haggling over high finance and snake soup.



3. Riga

The Latvian capital is home to wonderful art nouveau architecture and a cool central market housed in old Zeppelin hangars.



4. Lisbon

Capture the soul of Portugal's capital: follow the sound of a haunting Fado melody around its steep, pastel-coloured streets.



5. Istanbul

Formerly Byzantium then Constantinople, this diverse Turkish city on the Bosphorus welcomes you into its mosques and Grand Bazaar.



6. Warsaw

The city of Frédéric Chopin and Marie Curie hosts a stunning collection of castles, palaces and traditional Polish cuisine.



7. Mexico City

Built over the ruins of Aztec Tenochtitlán, today's capital rests on a lake bed and has been sinking steadily over the last 100 years.



8. Santiago

Busy squares, narrow alleys and street art dot Chile's capital, where you can dance the traditional *cueca* against an Andean backdrop.



9. Belfast

Remember the *Titanic* along the waterfront in Northern Ireland's capital, then take a walk through history at the Ulster Museum.



10. Athens

Democracy, philosophy and theatre all trace their roots to the Greek capital, dominated still by the Parthenon on the Acropolis.



11. Belgrade

Explore Serbia's historic capital, beginning at Belgrade Fortress in Kalemegdan Park. Attila the Hun is said to be buried nearby.



12. London

Britain's capital, which brought us pageantry and punk rock, continues to surprise with tales of the Tower and views from the Shard.



13. Moscow

Russia's famous Red Square sits beside Ivan the Terrible's onion-domed St Basil's. Travel in style through grand metro stations.



14. Tokyo

Sushi, sumo, Shinto shrines and cherry blossom gardens. All are lost and found amid the behemoth towers of Japan's capital.



15. New York

Superlatives are tested in the city that never sleeps. Broadway shines, SoHo sets new trends, and clouds make way for new skyscrapers.



16. Amsterdam

With Rembrandts and Van Goghs vying for attention in the museums, canal-side browsers also find shops, ships and other Dutch delights.



17. Sydney

With its Opera House as emblematic as Australia's koala bear, life in Sydney is 'beaut', from Bondi all the way to the Blue Mountains.



18. Queenstown

This former gold rush town's setting on New Zealand's South Island now attracts bungee jumpers, canyon swingers and *Lord of the Rings* fans.



19. Cape Town

Witness the dramatic setting on a ride up Table Mountain, move to the rhythm of Long Street and picnic in the botanical gardens.



20. Taipei

Temples and neon night markets delight, but the real draw is Taiwan's natural beauty: hot springs, giant waterfalls and more.



21. Giethoorn

Discover the Venice of Holland by boat. This delightfully picturesque village has no roads, just miles of idyllic canals.



22. Madrid

Locals relax around El Retiro Park and art lovers gaze at masters in the Prado, while delicious tapas give you a taste for Spain.

23. Bucharest

In Romania's stately capital, the Triumphant Arch and Victory Square compete for honours against the imposing Parliament Palace.

24. Sofia

East meets west in Bulgaria's ancient capital. Explore diverse cultural monuments and a wonderfully laid-back social scene.

25. Berlin

East and West Germany unite in sprawling parks, Bauhaus styles, an island of museums, Trabant tours and a varied cultural scene.

26. Los Angeles

Famous addresses dot this music and movie capital, from glamorous Rodeo Drive to Venice Beach by way of Sunset and Hollywood Boulevards.

27. Tallinn

'Fat Margaret' is just one of the curious names for impressive towers that dot the sea-faring capital of Estonia.

28. Montreal

Vieux-Montréal captures the eclectic styles of traditional Quebec's French Canadian ways among islands and waterways.

29. Tel Aviv

Life in Israel's 'Big Orange' centres on the beach, oyster restaurants and the cobbles of the Old Jaffa district.

30. Bogotá

While shoppers sip on Colombia's finest coffees and barter over prized green emeralds, more treasures await at the Gold Museum.

31. Brussels

Follow in Tintin's footsteps, perhaps to savor mussels and *frites* in Belgium's capital after seeing its famous *Manneken-Pis* statue.

32. Barcelona

Catalonia's eccentric spirit finds perfect expression in the Picasso Museum or amid the bumpy steeples of Gaudi's *Sagrada Família*.

33. Toronto

Canada's most populous and culturally diverse city sits prettily on the shores of Lake Ontario. Nearby Niagara Falls is a major attraction.

34. Paris

Rendezvous in the French capital for gargoyles at Notre Dame, nights at the Opéra, art deco Metro stations and landmarks at every turn.

35. Prague

Walk the Czech capital's Royal Route, from Hradčany's castle to the winding alleys of the Lesser Town and across Charles Bridge.

36. Rio de Janeiro

Sugar Loaf Mountain towers high above Brazil's carnival city, famous for sun-worshippers, the samba and Copacabana Beach.

37. Kiev

The craft stores lining Andrew's Descent, St Sophia's golden domes and the Pyrohovo open-air museum showcase a bygone Ukraine.

38. Budapest

Two cities in one, Buda and Pest span the Danube. Best views of the Hungarian capital are from the Fisherman's Bastion on Castle Hill.

39. Buenos Aires

Tango rhythms infuse the Argentine capital, where colours clash in the artistic Barrio Alto and giant steaks sizzle everywhere.

40. Quito

Steep colonial streets climb through Ecuador's capital, 2,800 metres up, where sun and rain take turns, four seasons in a day.

41. Vancouver

High-rises, hip cafés and galleries contrast with the Canadian rainforest, a short walk over the Capilano wooden footbridge.

42. Kuala Lumpur

Malaysia's capital boasts the soaring Petronas Towers and the old world Merdeka Square, once the cricket green of the Selangor Club.

43. Singapore

Colonial and modern unite in this island state, which mixes Malay, Chinese, Indian and Western flavours.

44. Vilnius

Legend says Lithuania's capital was founded because of a duke's dream. Today, the artists' quarter has its own constitution!

45. Adelaide

There's still a wild frontier feel about South Australia's first city, settled between rolling hills and golden beaches.

46. Bratislava

High over Slovakia's capital is its historic castle, overlooking the Danube and the traffic-free old town dotted with curious statues.

47. Rome

The catacombs and the Colosseum, chic boutiques and Vatican treasures will keep you coming back to Italy's Eternal City.

48. Seoul

Floats, flowers and lanterns will enchant you in South Korea's sprawling capital, home to elaborate palaces and quaint *hanok* houses.

49. Dubai

Ferry across Dubai creek on a traditional *abra*, then crane your neck to the top of the Burj Khalifa, rising 828 metres above the UAE.

50. Dublin

Ha'penny Bridge over the Liffey, the splendid Book of Kells and St Stephen's Green conjure a taste for Ireland.
